Thornbury Picture House presents two films this month. The first one is on Friday 3 October: *Kidnapped: the Abduction of Edgardo Mortara*, the story of a young Jewish boy living in Bolgna, Italy, who in 1858, after being secretly baptised, was forcibly taken from his family to be raised as a Christian. His parents' struggle to free their son became part of a larger political battle that pitted the

papacy against forces of democracy and Italian unification.

On Friday 31 October, *Reality* profiles the arrest of 25-year-old Air Force linguist and NSA contractor Reality Winner, for leaking to the press classified information pertaining to Russian interference in the 2016 US Presidential election. Adapted from the 2019 stage play, with dialogue pulled directly from Reality Winner's FBI interview.

Autumn at Thornbury and District Museum A new exhibition is now open — "Thornbury: A Garrison Town, WW2". Our district played an important, and perhaps unexpected, role in the Second World War, as it hosted a significant military presence throughout the war years. The exhibition looks at the various units which passed through the area and especially at Thornbury's 'own regiment' — a little-known and unusual section of the Royal Artillery that was raised in the town and taken into the hearts of the residents. What impact did the presence of hundreds of troops and the military aspects of the war have on the lives of the civilians? The exhibition features personal accounts remembering the armed forces, the fall of Dunkirk, aircraft crashes, the arrival of the 'Yanks', the build-up and effects of D-Day and much more.

In our upstairs exhibition room a related exhibition, "My Dear Mum" concerns the Harwich evacuees who stayed in Thornbury during the war. Their stories are told using personal letters, oral histories, photographs and other sources such as school logbooks.

We also have another, smaller display in our Coins Room which looks at education in Thornbury. The Museum is in Chapel Street and is open on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays 1-4pm and on Saturdays 10am-4pm. Entry is free.

The magnificent "Thornbury Quilt", which is part of the Museum's collection, is now on permanent display in an upstairs room at Thornbury Town Hall and can be viewed every Wednesday during the Town Hall's opening hours. This unique coverlet was created locally in 1900 and may have been part of one of many fundraising events held to raise money for a new vicarage. Some of its 236 squares represent local people and tradesmen and their stories and the story of how the quilt was rediscovered in 2013 are told in an accompanying audio-visual display.

The first meeting of the new season for Thornbury Local History and Archaeology Society is on Tuesday 14 October, with a talk by Ann Taylor, "Four Hundred Years of Stroudwater Mills". The Stroud area has for centuries been a centre for the woollen industry, not least because of the fast-flowing streams that provided power for mills. It was once famous for military uniforms and quality Saville Row material and is still a dominant force in the world markets for tennis and snooker cloth. Ann Taylor will explain the processes involved in producing fine woollen cloth and trace the changes in the mills resulting from the Industrial Revolution and the introduction of synthetic fibres. Ann is a retired Education Officer from Stroud Museum and a busy volunteer and Trustee of the Textile Trust. She was also one of the organisers of the beautiful walled garden at Stroud Museum.

<u>Update on The Armstrong</u> Renovation work started at the beginning of July. The old foyer and bar area have been stripped out and the ceiling removed from the Cossham Hall, ready to be replaced by a more energy efficient solution, while retaining the vaulted panelling to maintain the acoustic benefits. The works will continue through the rest of the year with the expectation that they will be finished by December.

An unexpected highlight in August was a visit to the site by Maggie Lansdown, the generous benefactor who has made Phase One of the renovation possible. She saw the progress made, heard about the future plans and met some of the people involved in the project. Her visit also provided an opportunity for some of the team to thank her.

As the builders transform and renovate, there is a hive of activity within the teams planning for the re-opening and management of the Cossham Hall and the bar and foyer. One group has been visiting other venues in the region to research prices, programmes, management and the role of volunteers in the new organisation – many will be needed! While it has been very encouraging to learn from these successful venues such as The Subscription Rooms at Stroud, the Memorial Theatre at Frome and The Goods Shed at Tetbury, it has also become clear that The Armstrong compares well in terms of space and flexibility, so the outlook is positive.

There will be many opportunities for community involvement and active support, including helping to clear, redesign and plant the outside space once the builders have cleared the site. Fundraising for Phase Two, the renovation of the Armstrong Hall itself, is paramount for the completion of the scheme, so that is also a vital and intensive activity in these months prior to completion of Phase One.

#### A fracas, a fire, and a forest

WO major events that happened hundreds of years ago have an unexpected link to our part of the world. October 21st 1805 saw one of the great sea battles which resulted in a decisive British victory, fought between the Spanish port of Cadiz and the Strait of Gibraltar. It was of course the Battle of Trafalgar where a combined Spanish and French fleet of 33 ships fought the 27 ships of Admiral Horatio Nelson. The battle shattered forever Napoleon's hopes to invade England, killing or wounding about 1,500 British seamen



and claiming the life of Nelson himself. Some 25 years later, the area known as Charing Cross in central London was re-named Trafalgar Square and by 1843 the now famous column was put in place. So how can all this possibly have anything to do with our part of the world?

The answer is the Forest of Dean, for it was from here that much of the timber was taken to build many of the ships that took part in the Battle of Trafalgar. It has been estimated



that *HMS Victory* alone required 6,000 trees for its construction, 90% of which was oak. The ancient Forest of Dean, once a royal hunting ground, has a history stretching back to Roman times and beyond, and is famous for its source of timber for Tudor warships. The forest was designated a National Forest Park in 1938 and today is still a working forest producing sustainable timber for UK and world markets.

The story now comes much closer to home because here in Thornbury we find another link. Long before the 3rd Duke of Buckingham, Edward Stafford, built Thornbury Castle, there was a large timber-framed manor house on the site, owned by the de Clare family at the time. A fire around 1236 seriously damaged the manor house and King Henry III ordered major repairs to be made using about 20 mature oak trees brought over from the Forest of Dean.

So the Forest, only a few miles across the River Severn, has played a significant role in both local and national history and with its wide variety of woodland and wildlife is today a popular destination for tourists.




